



#### The Asia Wastewater Management Partnership (AWaP) Operations Committee

## 1. Background and Objectives

In September 2015, the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) were adopted at the United Nations Sustainable Development Summit. Among the different selected goals and targets was established an important target for wastewater management: SDG target 6.3, which aims at "halving the proportion of untreated wastewater by 2030".

To contribute to the achievement of this target and the SDGs at large, six Asian countries launched the Asia Wastewater Management Partnership (AWaP) at the AWaP First General Meeting held on 25<sup>th</sup> July 2018 in Kitakyushu, Japan. During this meeting it was agreed that the AWaP secretariat would be located in Tokyo, Japan, and jointly operated by the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism (MLIT), Japan, and the Ministry of the Environment (MOE), Japan.

Among the different meeting agenda items, the participating countries discussed the implementation guidelines and the work plan of AWaP. Based on these implementation guidelines, the partnership consists of government officials from Asian countries engaged in policy-making for wastewater management and other related fields. The main objectives of AWaP are to organize regular meetings, share information on wastewater management, and discuss solutions for future improvements in this field. AWaP targets the mainstreaming of wastewater management in each participating country and among all the stakeholders involved in wastewater management. In addition to sharing the information needed for the improvement of wastewater management, AWaP targets the creation of models that can solve the existing challenges in order to promote each country's efforts towards the achievement of the SDG wastewater-related targets by 2030.

In accordance with the AWaP work plan, the Asia Wastewater Management Partnership (AWaP) Operations Committee is to be attended by the representatives acting as focal points for the participating countries. Currently, the first AWaP annual report is under preparation and due to be completed by the end of September 2019.

#### 2. Contents of Meeting

In the AWaP Operations Committee, the following points will be shared and discussed among the participating countries.

- Comments on the AWaP annual report
- Updates on the progress made in the mainstreaming of wastewater management
- Plans for the Second General Meeting of AWaP, which will take place at the location of the 4<sup>th</sup> Asia-Pacific Water Summit (2020 in Kumamoto, Japan)

On the day before the meeting is planned a site visit of a wastewater treatment facility. Following the AWaP Operations Committee will be held a technical seminar in which Japanese private companies will introduce

some of their technologies and products for wastewater management. After the technical semina, an observation tour of the Sewage Works Exhibition will be conducted.
